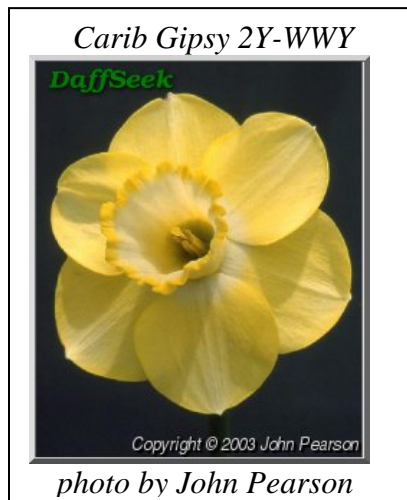

The third annual Pie Eater's Show will be held on Saturday, May 3. That's a long way and a lot of shows down the road from here, but it is still good to know that at the end of the season, there will be one more really fun final show.

The show will return to the parish hall in St. John Neumann Catholic Church in Reston, where it was held last year and enjoyed so much by the parishioners there. This year entries will be accepted ONLY on the day of the show and not on the day before. The hall will be open from 7:30AM Saturday and staging will not close until after lunch so there will be plenty of time to put in all the flowers you can bring. Both standard and miniature flowers are included in the schedule.

Who knows what the season will be like at this point? What I have learned from the last two years, however, is this: It doesn't really matter if this show is a large show or a small one, it is and another chance to get together with daffodil friends and the last sweet blooms of the season before the end of spring.

When I first had the idea to stage a late season show, some thought it would be a waste of time, but the last two years have proven that not to be the case. The schedule has been carefully designed to meet the requirements of ADS which provides us with ADS collection ribbons and show awards. To make the competition even more exciting and fun, "special" collection classes have been included which will challenge exhibitors to compete for prizes.

Judges are not formally invited to this show as they are elsewhere. But if you are an accredited judge and you come, I'll be glad to see you and make sure you have a judging assignment. The reason I do not invite is because it is impossible to guess how many will be required to get the job done. (Student judges are also welcome.) I was especially grateful to have Anne Donnell Smith last year who drove down from Baltimore and I hope to see her back again, as well as others who live north of Washington and are more likely than not to have flowers to show. To help me figure out how much food to plan for, please, if you can, let me know the week before the show if you think you will be coming.

WASHINGTON DAFFODIL SOCIETY -- Meeting Minutes

Board Meeting: October 20, 2007

The WDS Fall Board meeting was held October 20 at the Falls Church Community Center in Falls Church, Virginia. In attendance were Kathy Welsh, Mary Semrad, Robert Darling, Ruth Ann McGrail, Fran Higgins, Chriss and Spencer Rainey, Bob Huesmann, Dorothy Sensibaugh, Mary Koonce and Lucy Rhame. Guests included Tom Taylor, Lina Huesmann, and Clay Higgins. The meeting commenced at 10:30 a.m. The minutes of the June meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Huesmann reported that there is currently \$13,400 in the checking account and \$20,000 invested in CD's. The balance in checking does not reflect the approximate \$10,000 cost of the bulb order. After payment of expenses, the checking account will retain approximately \$3,000 so the \$5,400 of funds from the CD coming due 10/21/07 will not be fully reinvested to allow for liquid funds needed to restock items for the boutique. Annually, WDS comes close to breaking even on operations. Sources of revenue include about \$3,000 from profit on the bulb order and dues of about \$2,000. Other revenue sources are approximately \$800 in interest on accounts and monies earned from the boutique.

Convention: Chriss Rainey reported that plans for the convention are moving along. The 2008 ADS convention will be held at the Sheraton West, Richmond, Virginia from April 10 -12. Robert Darling will be in charge of the photography section and Mary Semrad is in charge of the boutique. Robert made a motion and Spencer seconded that Robert be allotted an additional \$200 for the purchase of materials to build photo properties for the convention. WDS will own the properties following the convention. As WDS does not need the properties at this time, the motion was amended to state that if the convention makes money, a reimbursement will be requested. The motion passed by a vote of 5 - 3. A volunteer is needed to stage the commercial exhibits and in the absence of commercial exhibitors, to stage an educational exhibit of the Wister winners.

Bulb Order: Mary Koonce reported that due to a postal strike in Northern Ireland and heavy rains in Cornwall, some bulbs were not received in satisfactory condition which will result in some refunds.

Membership: Tom Taylor agreed to meet members at the door as they arrived to the meeting this afternoon in order to collect money from those owing dues this year. **Newsletter:** Mary Anne Barton had no report.

WDS 2008 Show: The show will be held at Brookside Gardens in Wheaton, Maryland. Entries will be accepted April 4, judging April 5, and take down April 6. The WDS show manual that was written in the 90's has been scanned onto a CD and needs to be updated and revised. Tom Taylor has agreed to co-chair the 2008 show. Mary Koonce made a motion, seconded by Robert, that Dorothy should buy a bolt of green, scotch-guarded fabric to supplement the fabric already used in the show. Motion passed.

Nominating: Mary Anne read the proposed slate for the coming year. Kathy Welsh, President (second 1 year term); Mary Semrad, Vice President (second 1 year term). Directors for terms ending 12/31/2010 are Spencer Rainey (second term), Karen O'Meara (second term), Tom Taylor (first term) and Holly Ruffin (first term).

Pie Eater's Show: Chriss Rainey reported that the show will be held the first weekend of May in the same location as last year. No staging the night before. The flowers will be given away to attendees of the church services on Sunday.

Spring 2008 Luncheon. The luncheon will be held March 8, 2008 at Union Street Public House in Old Town Alexandria, Virginia. Mary Anne will work on a program, possibly on companion planting and garden daffodils. Mary Anne made the motion and Fran seconded that up to \$100 should be allocated for the speaker's fee for the luncheon, exclusive of lunch, to be paid by WDS. Motion passed.

Summer 2008 Picnic: Possibly to be coordinated with Maryland Daffodil Society.

New Business: Glassware: After much discussion, it was agreed that Kathy and Robert would work on a design of a pair of Division 6 daffodils on wine glasses. Planting on the DC Mall: On November 15 at 11 a.m., Trust for the National Mall Public Launch and area school children under the leadership with the Park Service will plant 3,000 daffodil bulbs on the National Mall highlighting the themes of restoration, preservation and education of this park to world class standards.

Newsletter Articles: Kathy asked for suggestions for educational articles for the newsletter. Suggestions included 'From Data Bank to Daffseek' by Robert and 'Collections' by Bob. Mary Koonce reported that the \$150 worth of bulb purchases approved at the prior meeting went to purchase 200 Monal bulbs to be planted in West Virginia along Blue Star Memorial Highway markers, in Sheperdstown and by the American Cancer Society.

Boutique: Mary Semrad voiced concern about the transportation of boutique items from the Washington storeroom to the Richmond convention in the spring. It was suggested that members divvy up loads to make the trip south. The purchase of projection equipment will be brought up at the next meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 12:20.

The **annual meeting** of the membership was called to order at 1:30pm. All business above was presented. The membership approved the slate of nominees as presented above.

The annual meeting was adjourned at 2 pm

My One Hundred Favorite Daffodils

Last fall I asked six WDS members to send me a list of their one hundred favorite daffodils. It is obvious from the responses that most are mathematically challenged since only two lists actually contained one hundred names. Mary Koonce, Clay Higgins, Bob Huesmann, Richard Ezell, Ann Donnell Smith and I all came up with a list of daffodils we couldn't live without if we were forced to cut our collections back to only 100 cultivars. I took these names and typed them into an Excel spreadsheet. This allowed me to sort the names and relay the information to you in a meaningful way.

Much to my surprise, only five cultivars made **everyone's list**: Carib Gipsy 2Y-WWY, Conestoga 2W-GYO, Miss Primm 2Y-Y, Killernan 3W-GYR, and Muster 4Y-O.

Those listed **five times** include Banker 2, Clouded Yellow 2, Evesham 3, La Paloma 3, New Penny 3, POPS Legacy 1, Rapture 6, Royal Marine 2, and Tuscarora 1.

Cultivars appearing **four times** are: Chorus Line 8, Crackington 4, Gold Convention 2, Gull 2, Homestead 2, Intrigue 7, Noteworthy 3, Pacific Rim 2, Pink China 2, Pink Silk 1, Quiet Waters, River Queen 2, Silent Valley 1, Stratosphere 7, Tahiti 4, Trena 6, and Tripartite 11.

Finally, those with **three listings** are: American Dream 1, Areley Kings 2, Arrowhead 6, Ashland 2, Blisland 9, Bryanston 2, Cape Point 2, Carole Lombard 3, Celtic Wings 5, Cherrygardens 2, Circuit 7, Cornell 3, Crowndale 4, Engagement Ring 3, Falconet 8, Fragrant Rose 2, Fresh Lime 1, Geometrics 2, Goldfinger 1, Hambleton 2, Haunting 3, Holme Fen 2, Jack Wood 11, Katrina Rae 6, Lavalier 5, Loch Lundie 2, Magic Lantern 1, Mowser 7, Oregon Pioneer 2, Oryx 7, Purbeck 3, Saberwing 5, Scarlet Tanager 2, Segovia 3, Snipe 6, Spindletop 3, Sunday Chimes 5, Sweetness 7, Trigonometry 11, and Unknown Poet 9.

January, February and March are the perfect months to evaluate your collection and make a list of new cultivars you wish to purchase in the coming year. If the above cultivars aren't part of your collection then you may want to add them to your wish list. Now is also a great time to enter your collection on the computer. There's nothing worse than buying something a second or third time by mistake. Cameras ready, printers poised—select and prepare your photos for the WDS SHOW. Then shape them to be seen by a wider audience at the ADS National Show in Richmond. While the weather keeps us inside, dream spring — prepare to enter the coming daffodil shows with your photographs. It's a wonderful way to maximize our artistic interest in the daffodil and share our vision with friends and the public. *Now* is the time to visit your photo files, find previous photos then “groom” them for inclusion in upcoming Spring Shows.

Both shows, and others in our area, encourage new work and some of you may be fortunate to visit shows south of DC to photograph new material. Gloucester, Garden Club of Virginia, and a visit further south to Clay's new venue in North Carolina all offer early promise, as do shows on the West Coast and even further south. A few of you are also planning trips to see early daffodils abroad in the wild. We need to see the best of your photos. The only proviso is against showing a photo that has won a blue ribbon in either the WDS (for WDS Shows) and a blue ribbon in previous ADS National Shows. This year the National will also award for the first time the newly authorized ADS Wells Knierim Ribbon [please check spelling] for the Best Photograph in the Show.

The WDS Show has all the same classes as last year where we featured only Four classes by combining p-2/p-3, p-4/p-5, p-6/p-7 below, and subdividing if warranted by number or type of entry. This year there will be additional display space. Bring your photos!

Classes at the National Show in Richmond include:

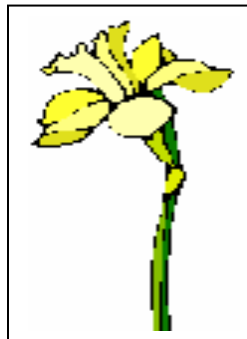
- P-1 Portraits of Daffodils – a close-up of a single daffodil bloom, or up to three blooms of same cultivar.
- P-2 Daffodils in the Landscape or Garden.
- P-3 Daffodils in their Native/Natural Habitat.
- P-4 Daffodils and People.
- P-5 Daffodils and Animals
- P-6 An arranged still life incorporating daffodils.
- P-7 Abstract or special effects incorporating daffodils or daffodil elements.



All these classes may include Monochrome or Color photos not smaller than 5" x 7" or larger than 16" x 20" including any simple, lightweight optional matt.

As you review your photographs select and refine or crop to emphasize the best photograph within any two dimensional rectangle you choose. Mine your work from last season and dream of spring. It's now amazing what you can achieve at your own computer or at the many commercial outlets for printing photos. Mount or matt them on lightweight card stock to enhance their display, bring your best to the show and expect some ribbons. We look forward to seeing your best efforts in April.
